

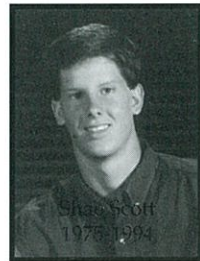
Football Season Played in Memory of Former Cat

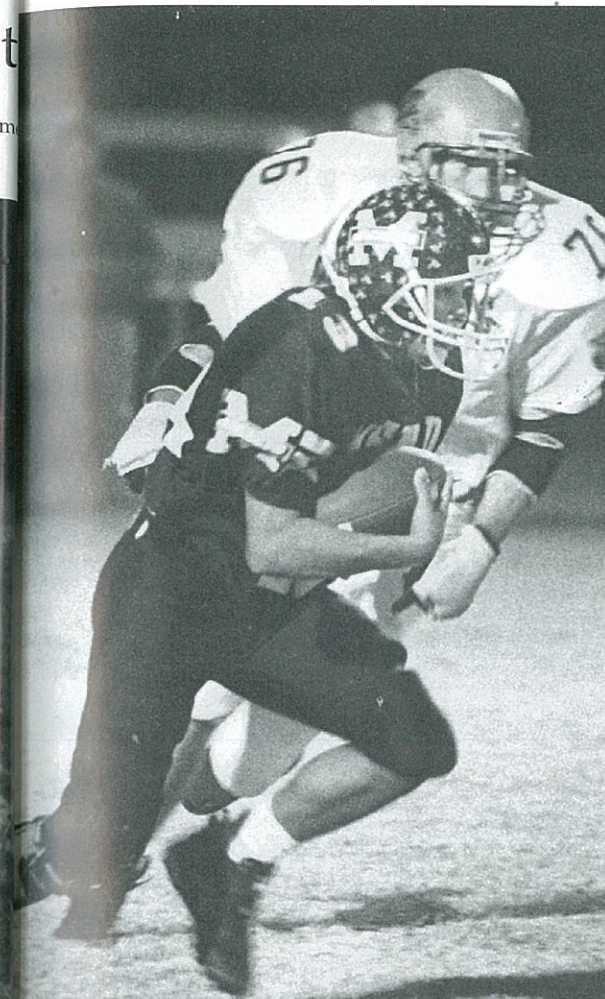
Shae's death left the '94 Cats with a heavy sense of loss and grief but also with a determination to live for the moment and to be the very best they could be.

The return to the I suited the Wildcats very well as they plowed through the remainder of non-district, district, and three post-season play-off games before the season came to a sudden halt at the hands of the Sudan Hornets in the quarter-finals game.

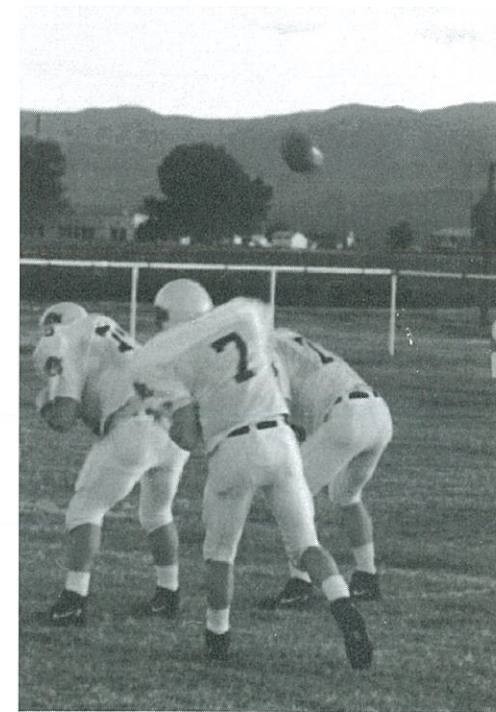
