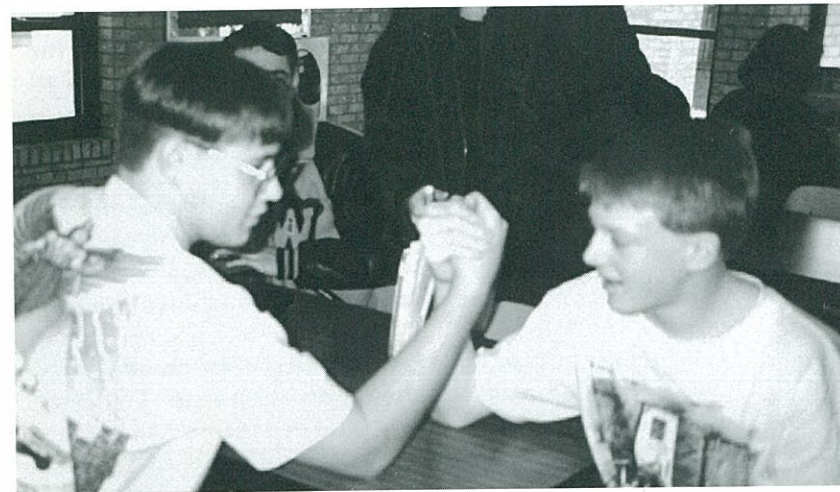


The *No Fear* attitude allowed the student body to successfully juggle demanding schedules and commitments without hesitation.

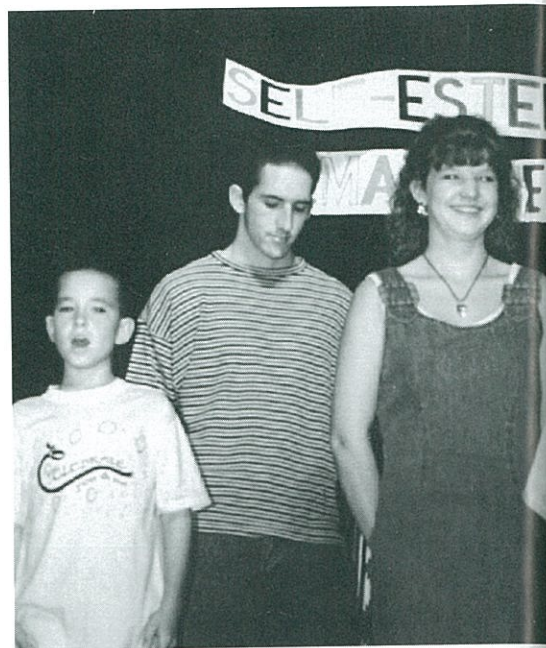
The final bell rang at 3:50p.m. dismissing some students for the day or sending many to after school extra-curricular activities. The busy days never dampened Wildcat Spirit!



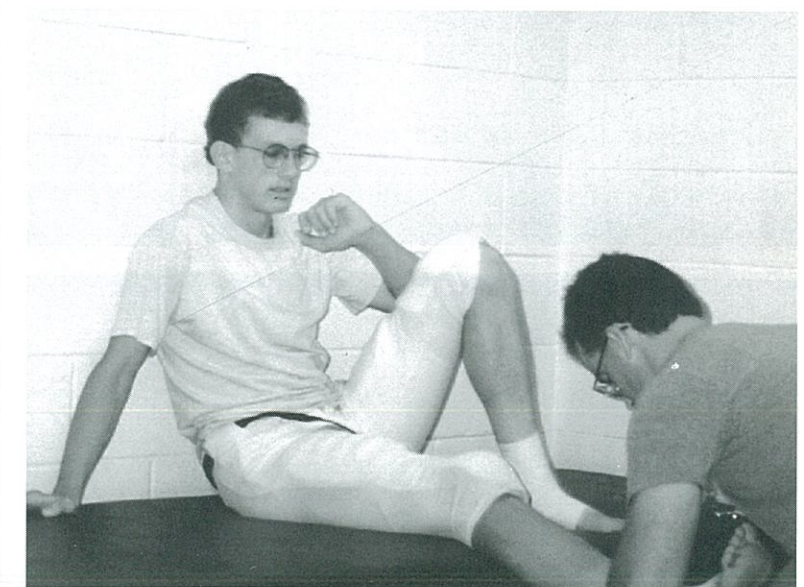
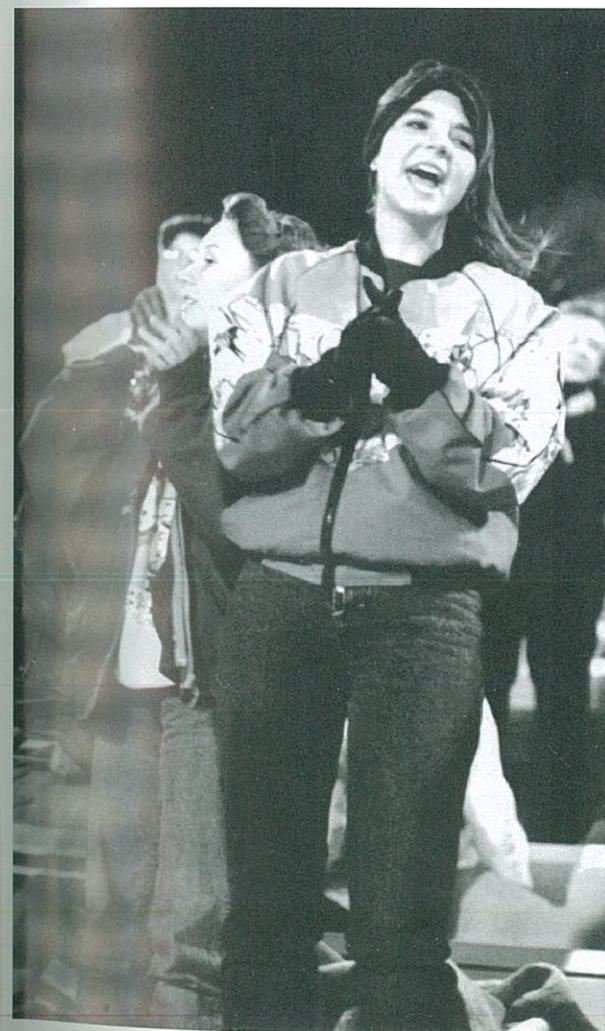
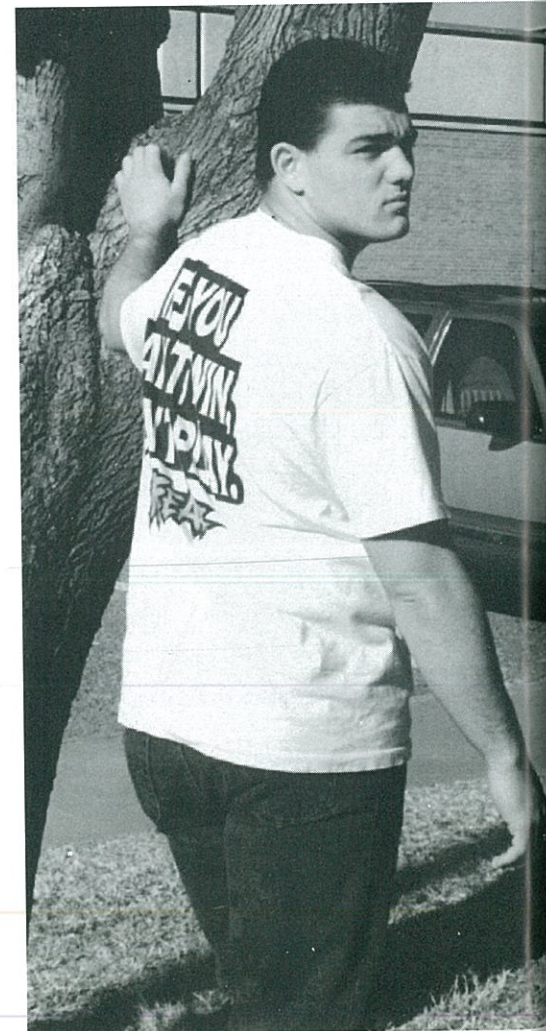
Sophomores Ben Haring and Brandon Jones found time to arm wrestle during the morning break period.
