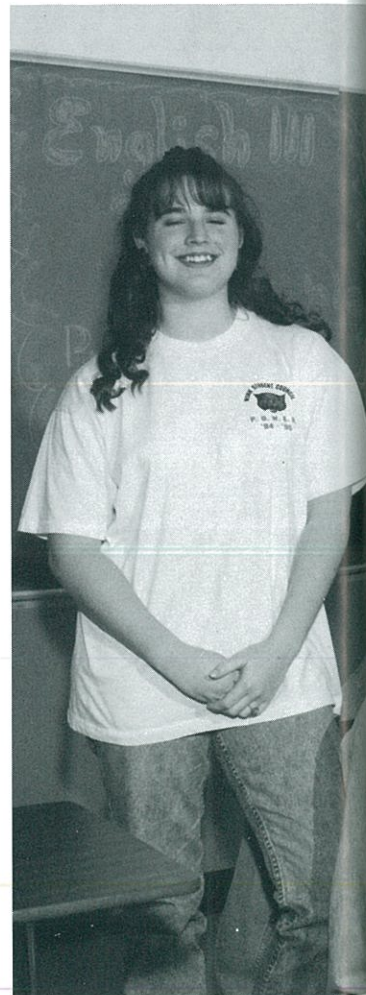
Freshman class representative, Shawn Matthews, found a twin in senior Jacob Blair for some needed points on 'Twin Day.'
