

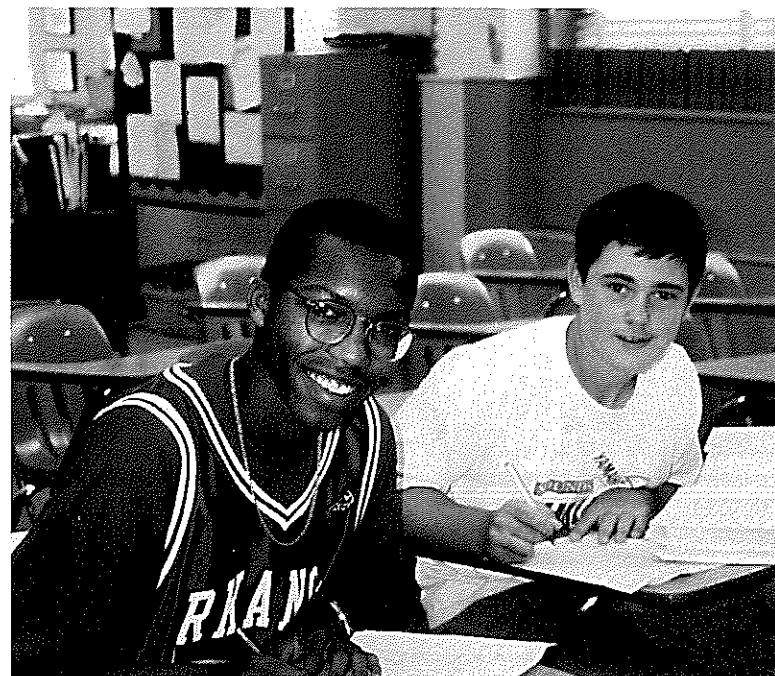
NO MATTER WHAT THE DIRECTION Here come the Cats!
