

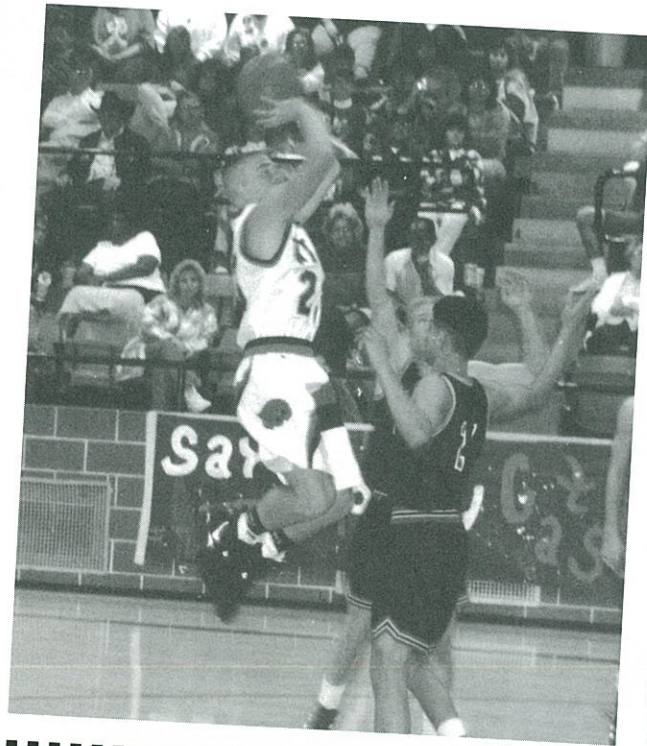
# Late Start Slows Hoopsters

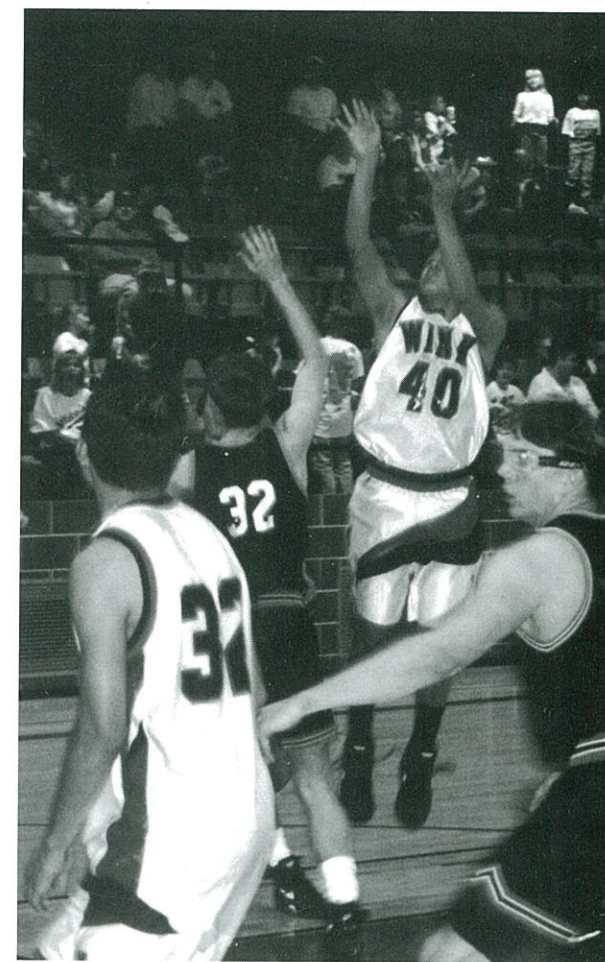
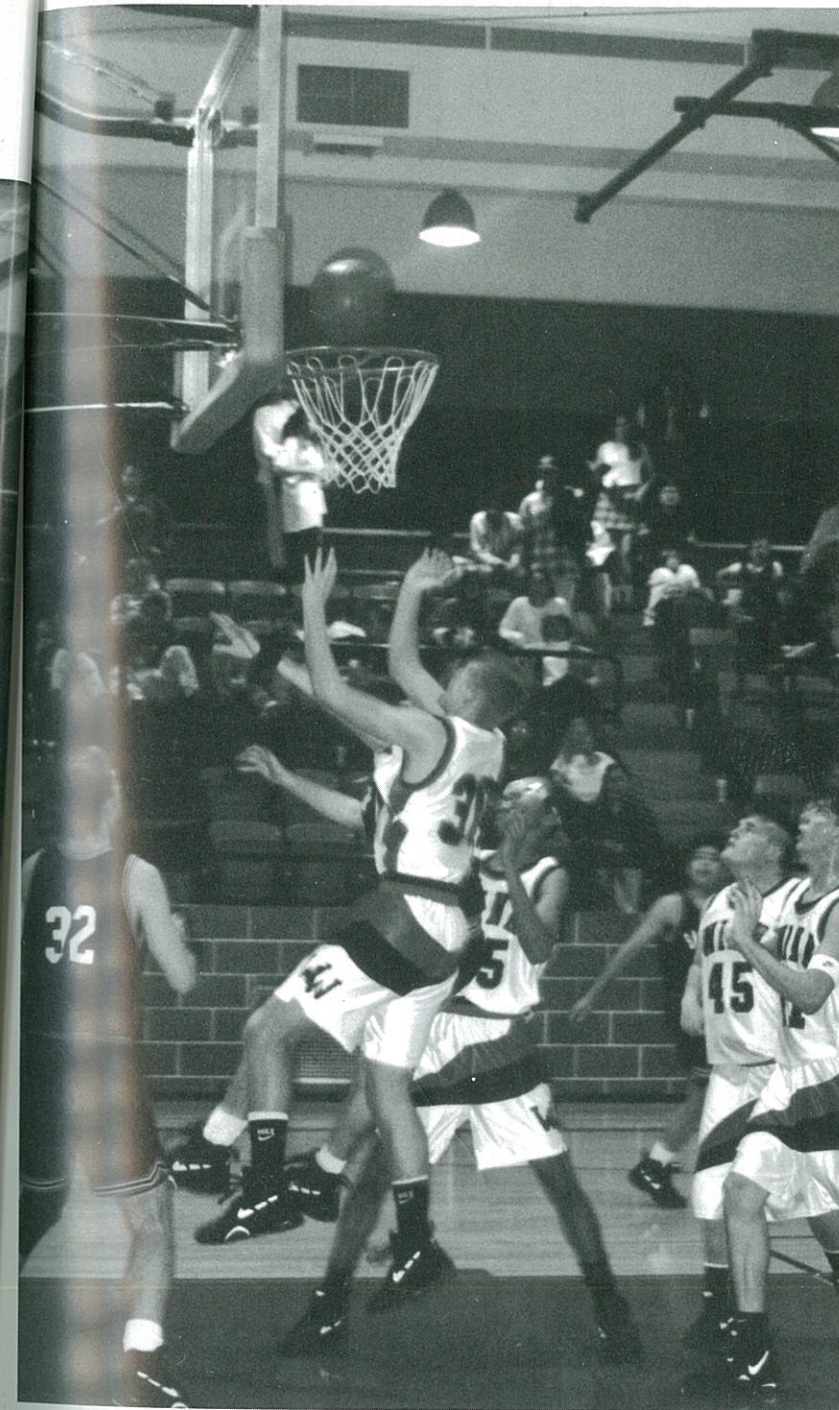
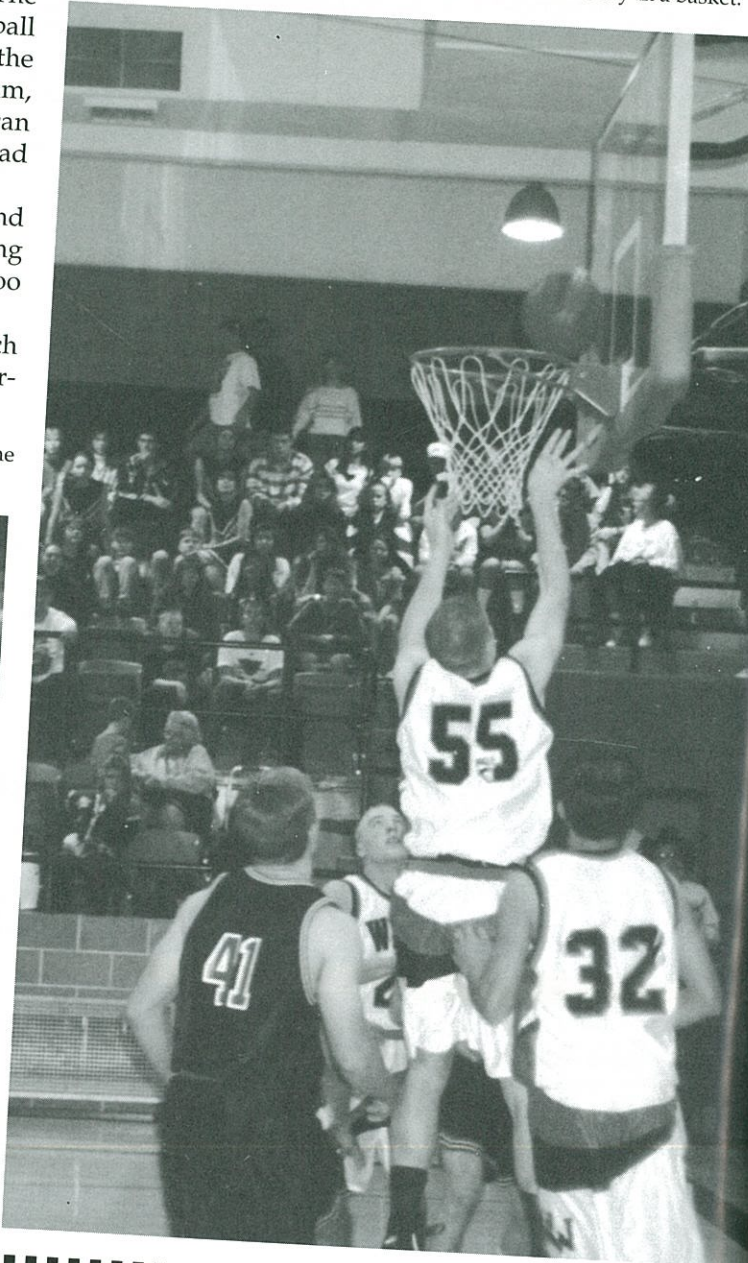
It takes time to make this many adjustments, and by the end of the season, the Wildcats were playing with precision. However, the fine-tuning came too late for the team to make the play-offs.

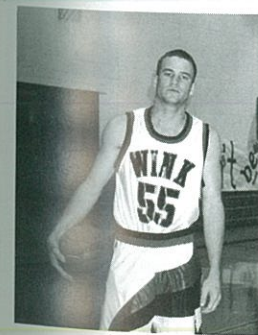

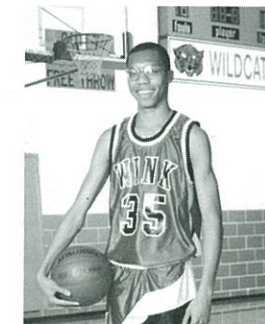
