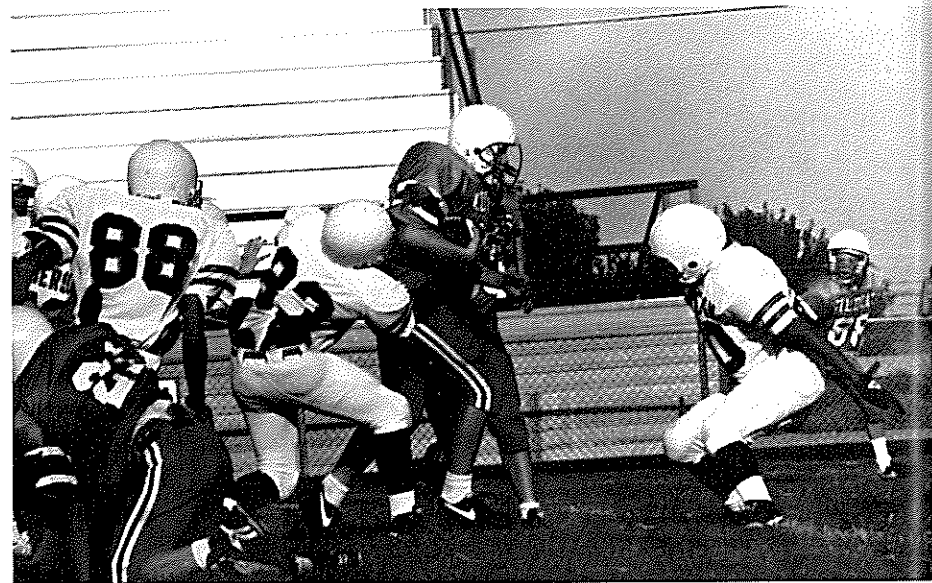
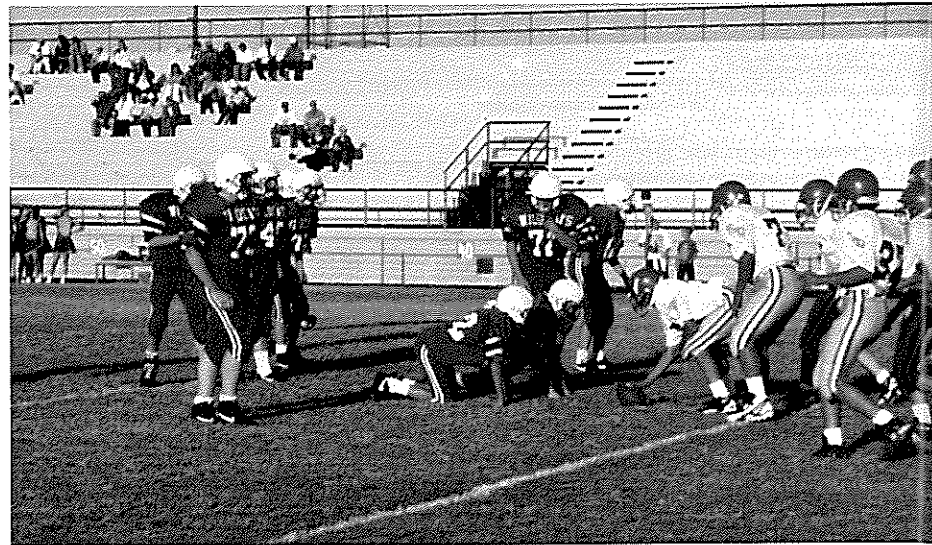
Coach Roger Martin saw his young men gain valuable experience and make major contributions in game after game. He said, "The boys and coaches are looking forward to a good year next season."

The defensive line gets set to rush the Fort Davis offense.

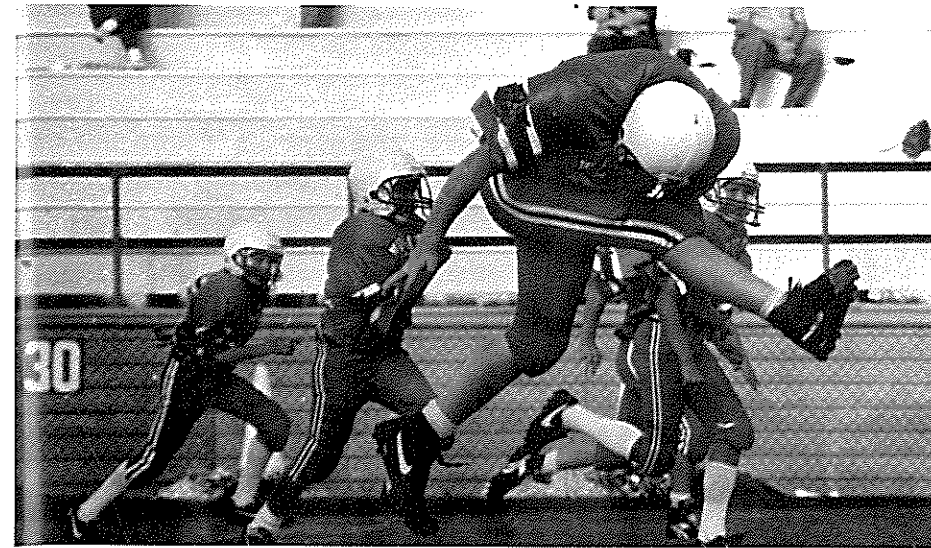
John Allen Henderson keeps on charging through the opposing team.
