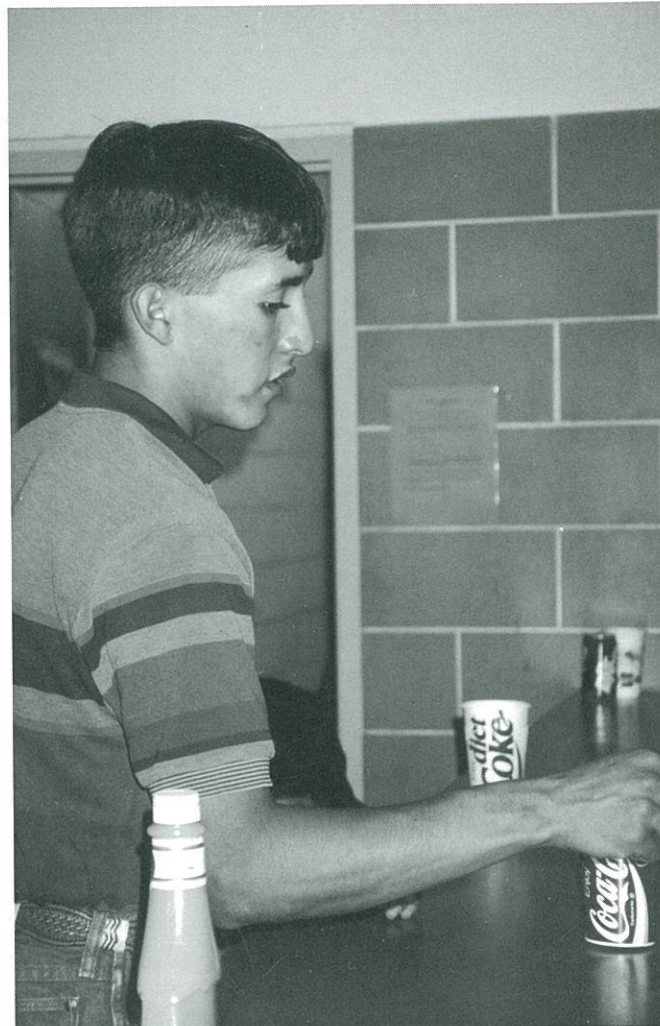
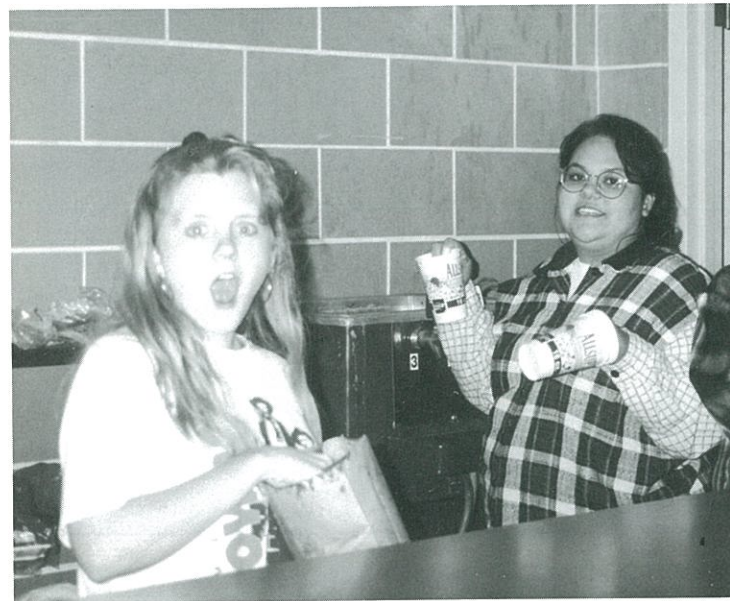


\$\$\$ Makes the World Go Around

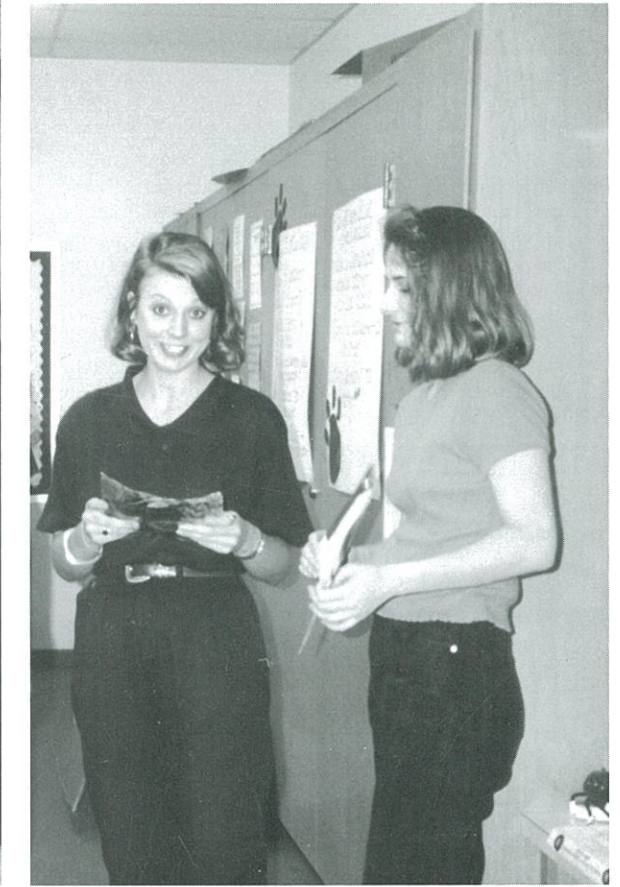
The band, student council, and the junior and senior classes worked in concession stands and sold everything from programs for the football games to the ever favorite Valentine's Day carnations.

Seniors Melissa Vaught, Delfy Rey, and Tim Lara work diligently in the concession stand to earn a few more points toward their senior trip.



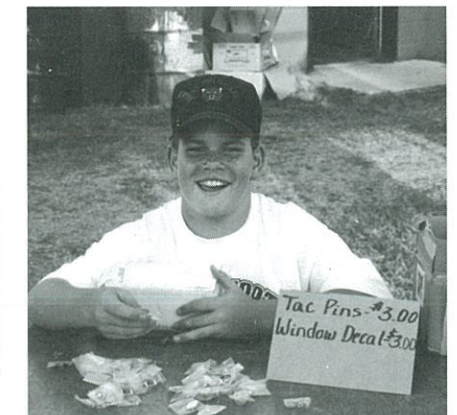
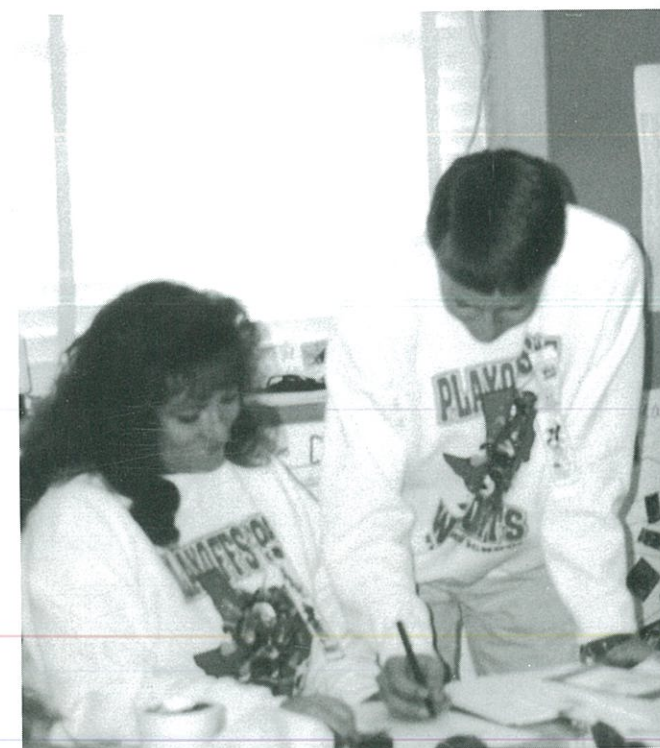
