357 Points Wins District UIL

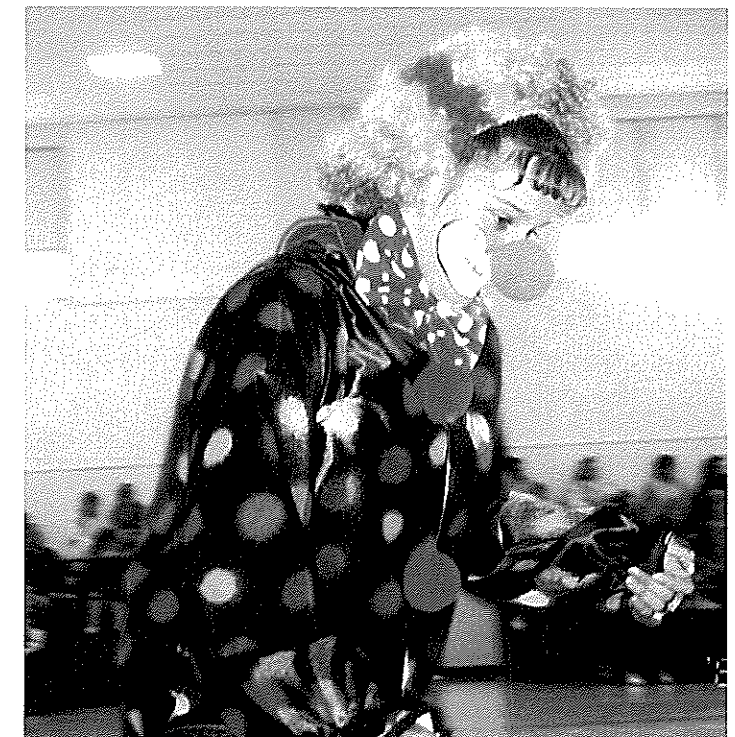

Every rodeo needs a clown, and the Kindergarten Rodeo was no exception. Eighth grader Mandi McCallister filled the clown shoes very well.

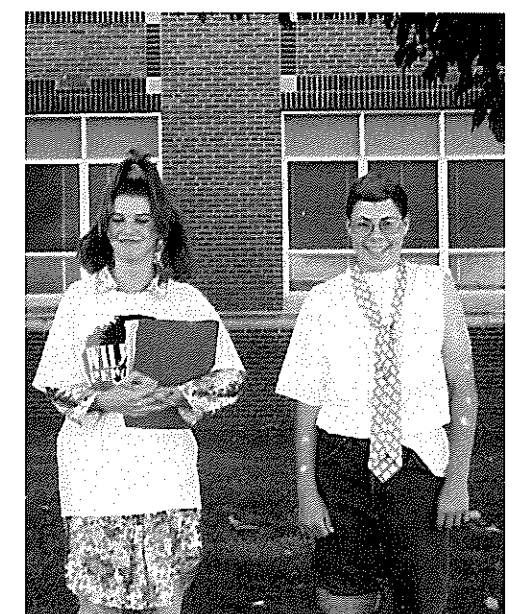
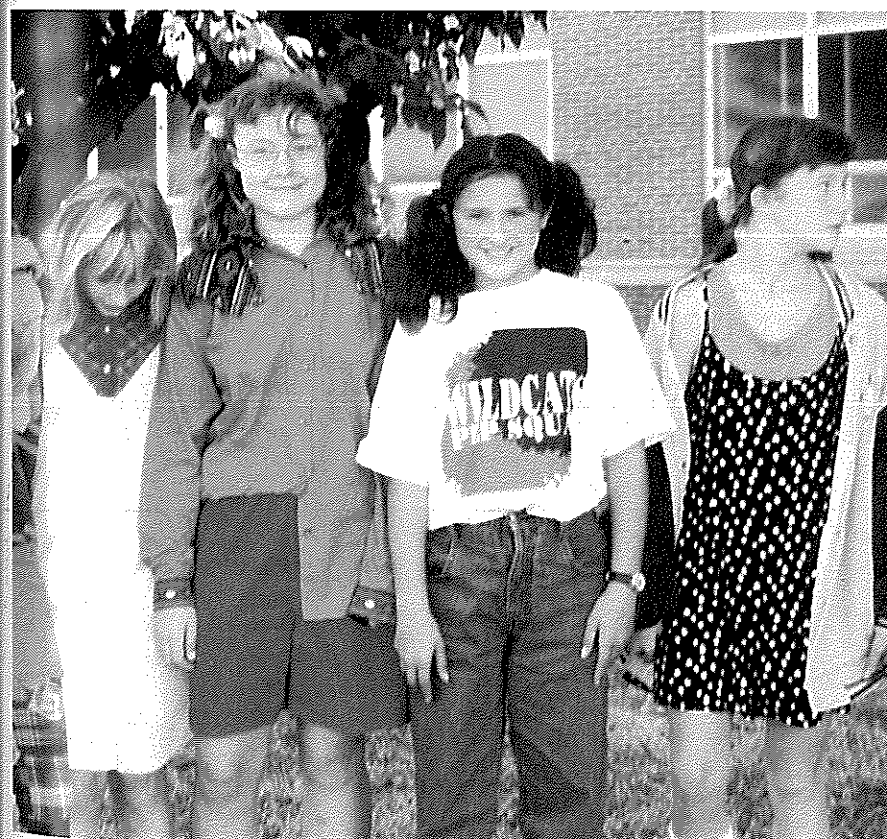
