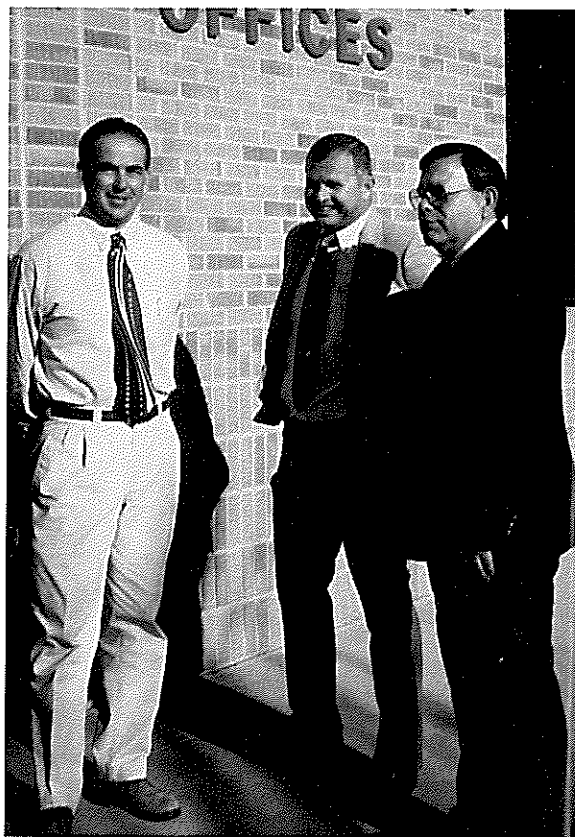


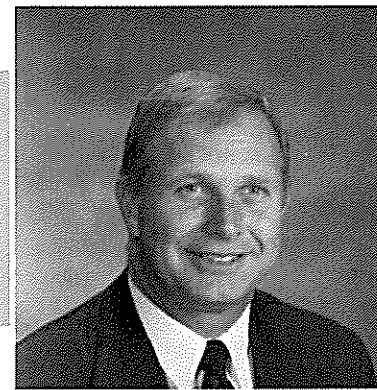
W.L.I.S.D. administrators, John Benham, Maxie Watts, and Danny Carrillo work together to keep students, teachers and parents happy.

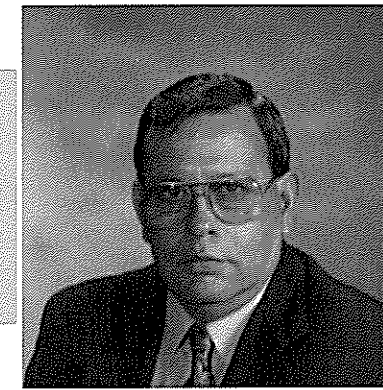

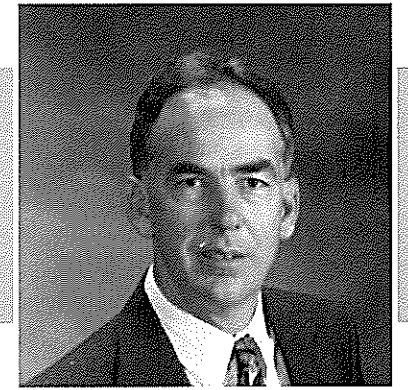

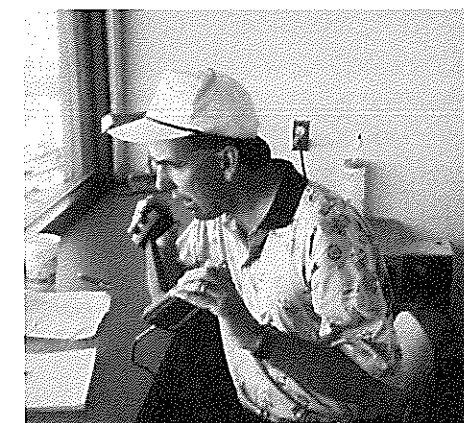
