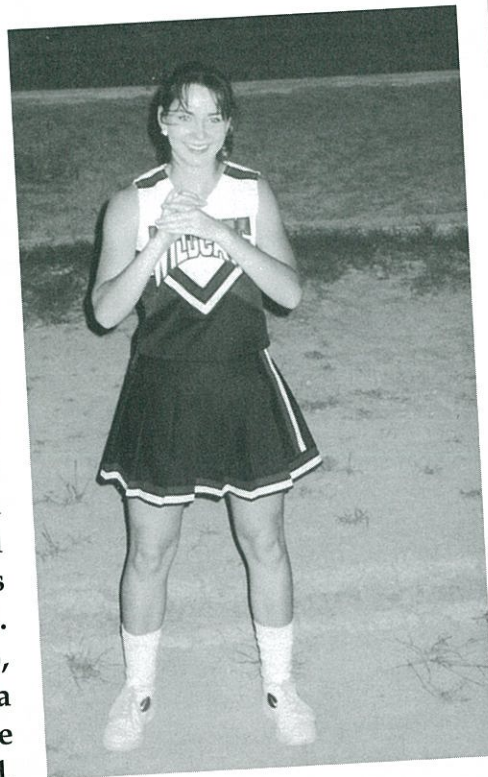


Catch Wildcat Fever

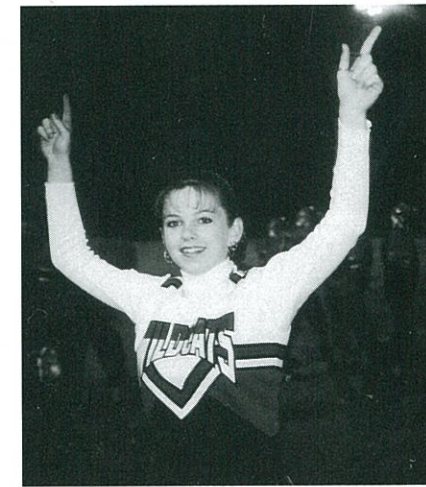

Even after the long bus ride to Presidio, Suzanne Kelton still enjoys cheering for her favorite team.



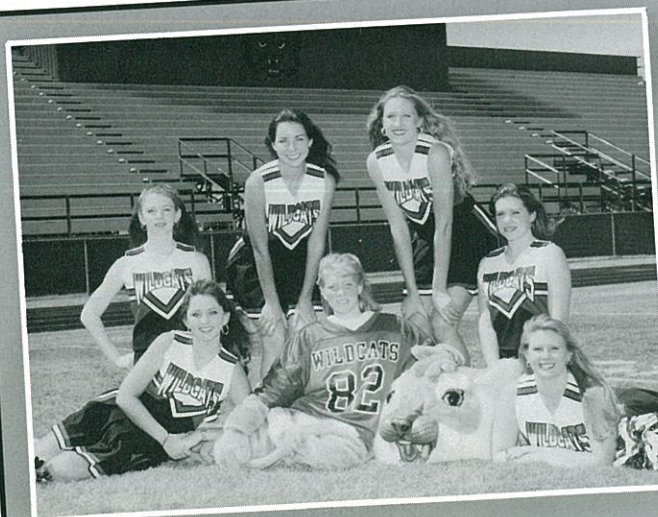
Junior high, junior varsity and varsity cheerleaders traditionally join forces to make the Homecoming pep rally extra special.

Michelle Harbin celebrates a Wildcat touchdown to the tune of the Victory March.

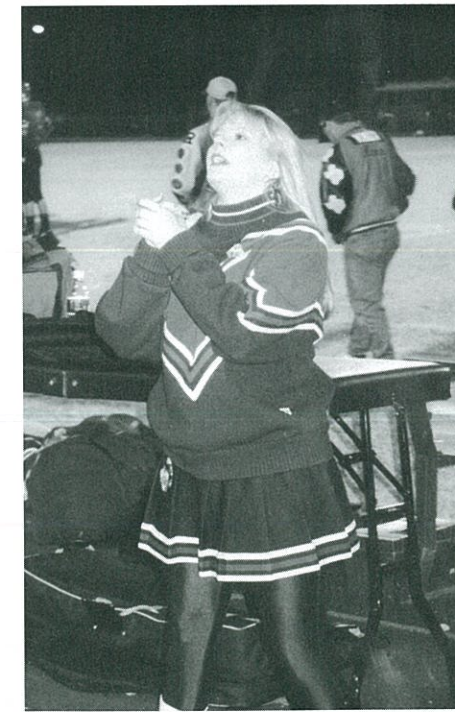

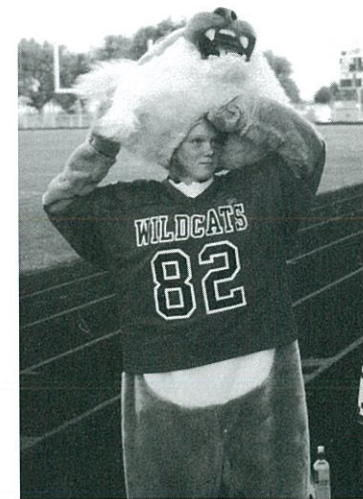
