

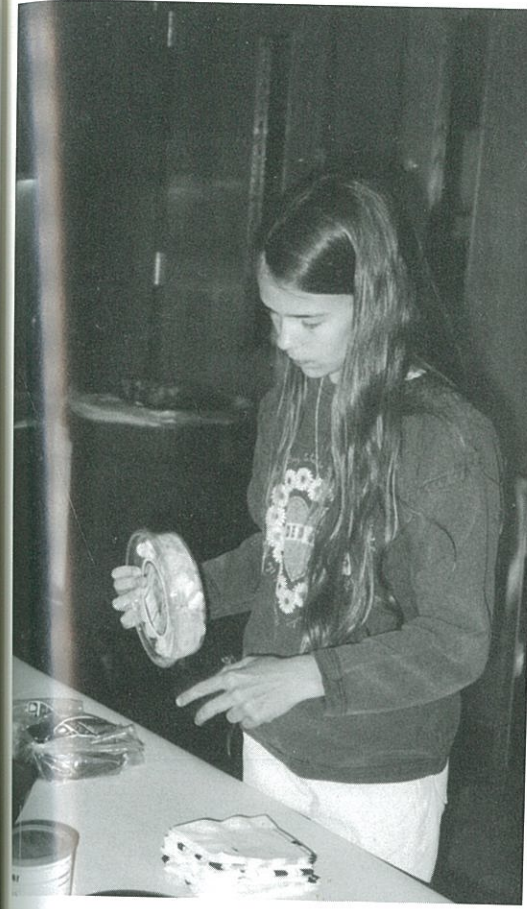
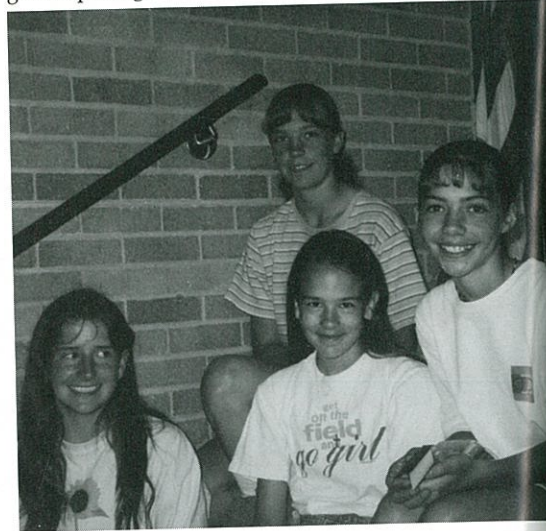
Stretching things to the limit

Students score 427 points to retain District UIL title.

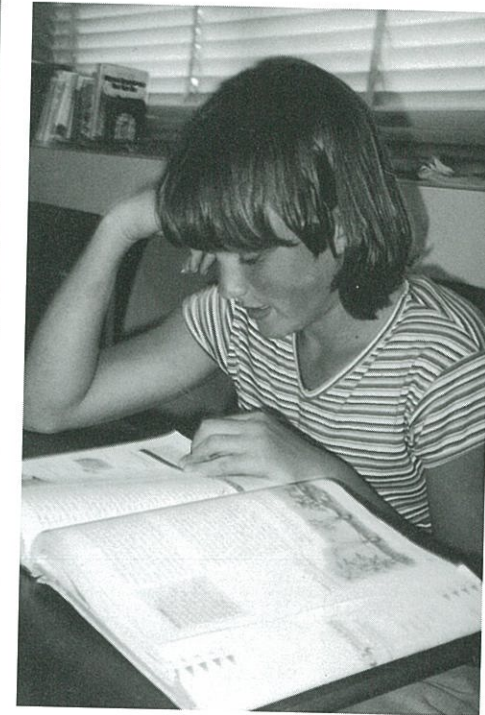

Seventh grade student council representative Kelli Benham prepares the refreshment table for the Valentine's Day Dance. Junior high council members are a big part of the council's success.



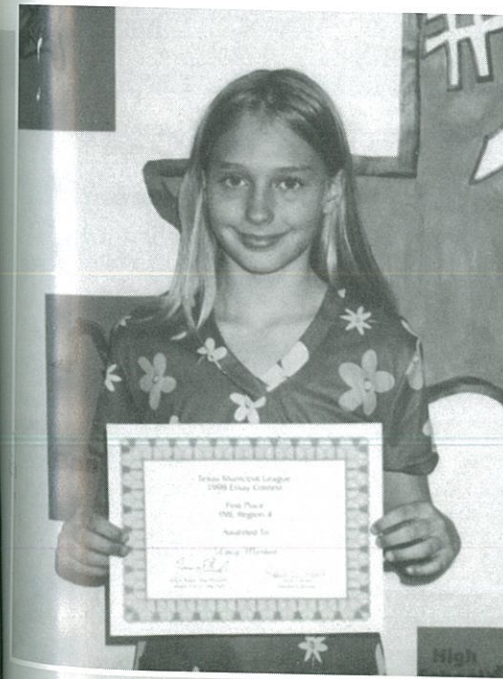

4-H Club



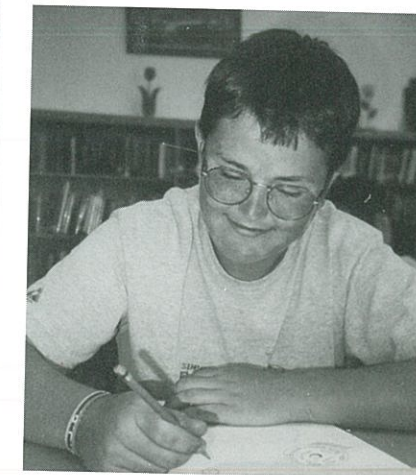
