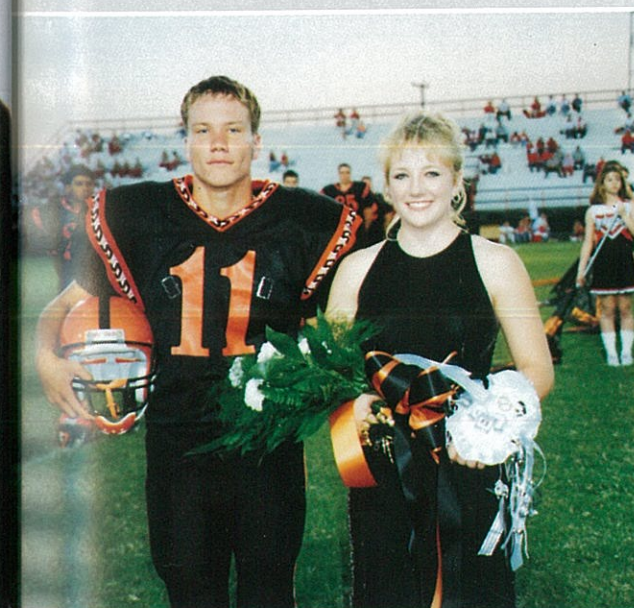
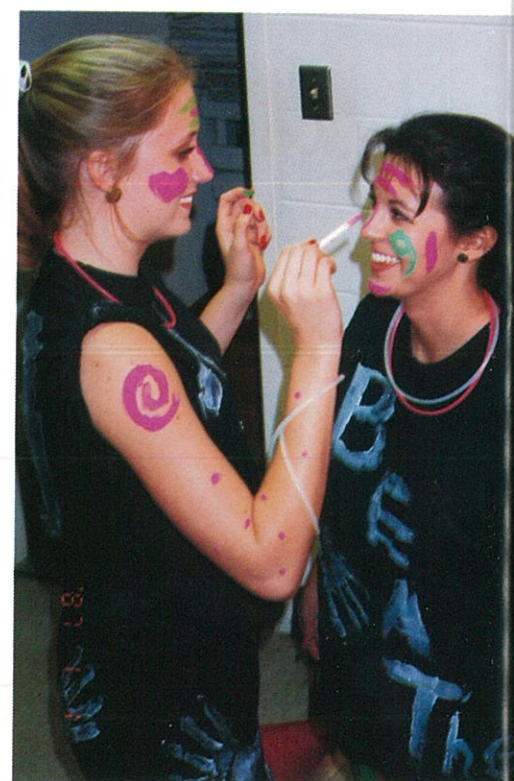
With red roses in hand, 1998 Homecoming Queen senior Jennifer McGehee and her brother Ben beam with excitement moments after her pre-game coronation.

A crowd of well wishers, including junior Crystal Smith, rush to congratulate the newly crowned queen.

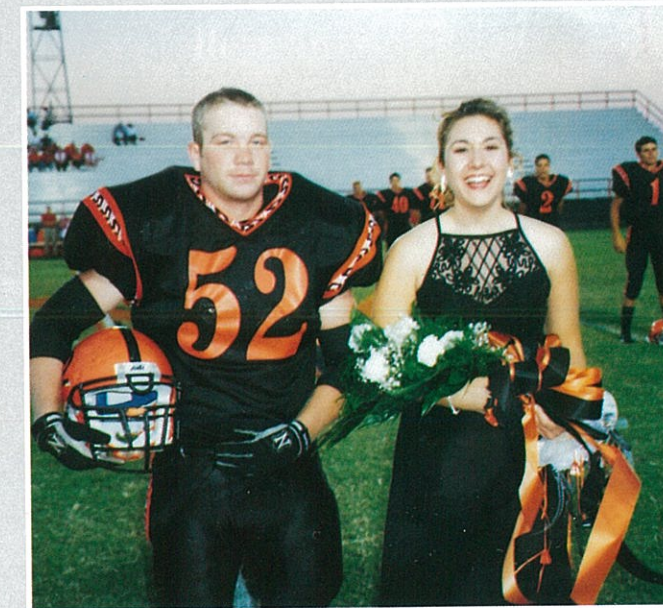
