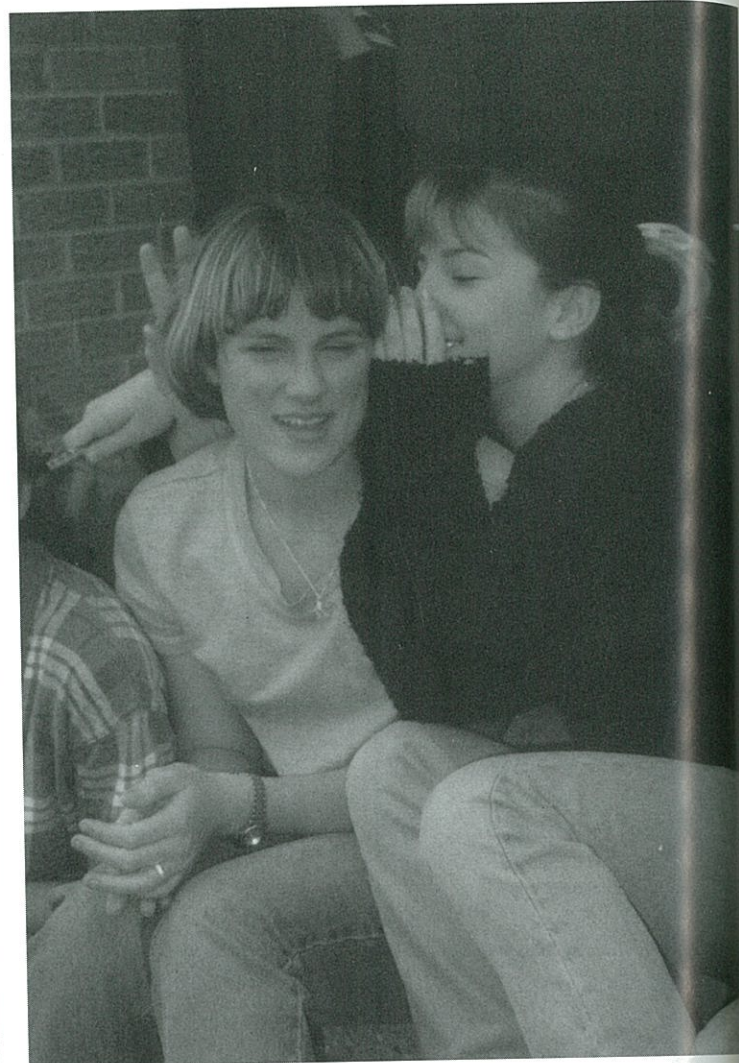
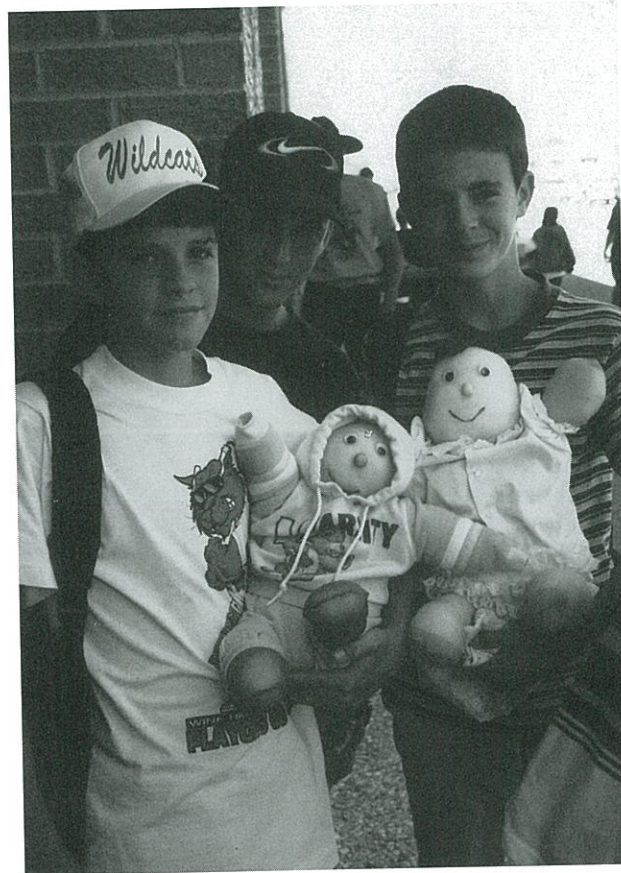
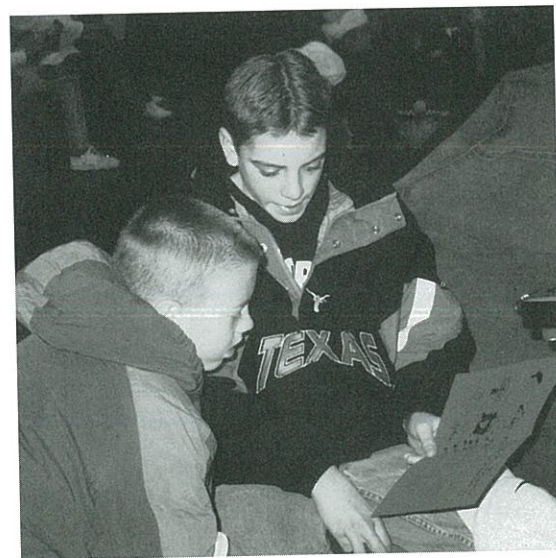


Lunch break gives Lindsay Graham and Karah Northcutt a chance to catch up on the latest junior high gossip.

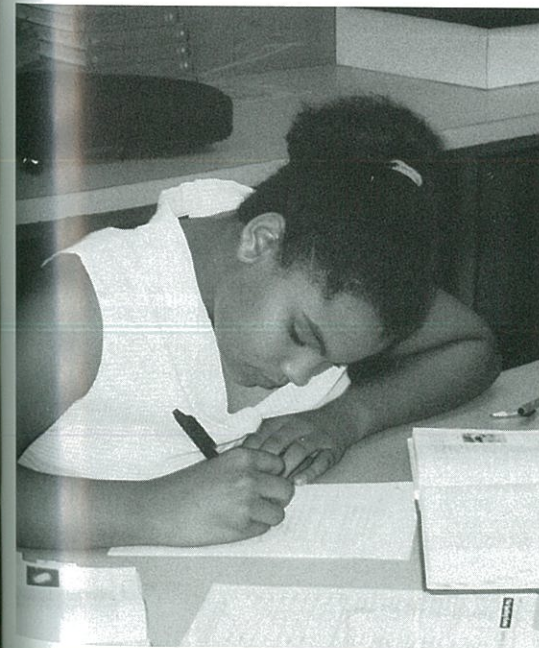
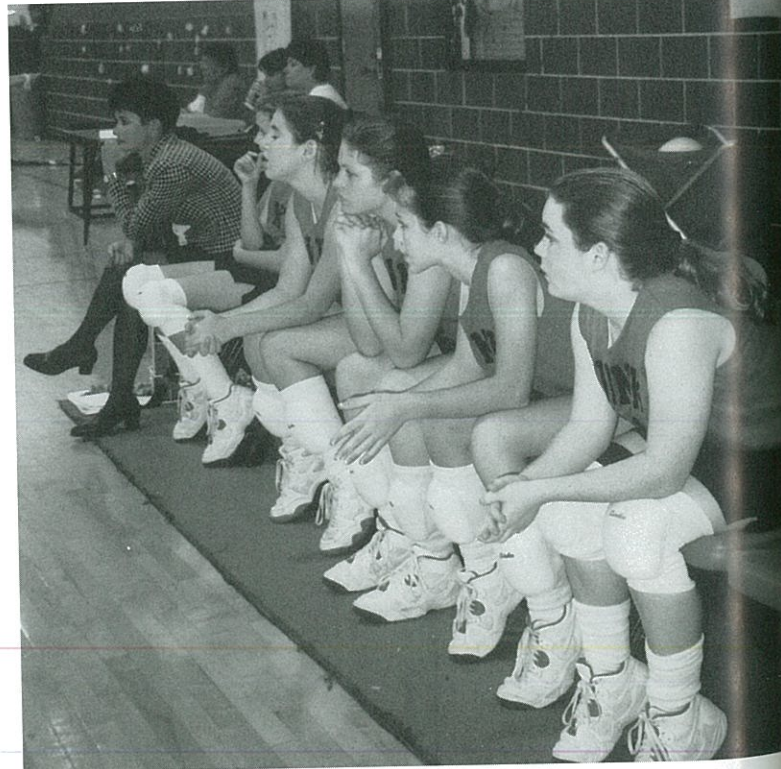


As an active member of the student council, seventh grader Dallas Thomas dressed up at Halloween to participate in the council's safety program for the elementary students.
