in victories for young Cats!*



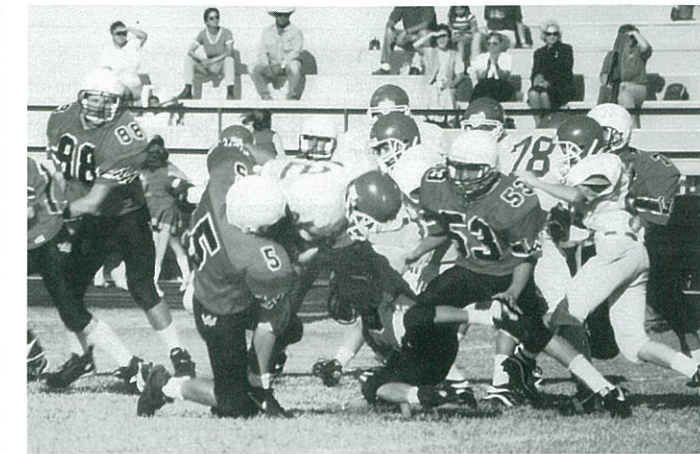
The ever opportunistic Wildcats take advantage of the Garden city Bearkats misfortune as Daniel Gray goes after a fumble caused by William Wilkinson.

Eighth grader Terry Rich one of the leading rushers on the junior high team breaks loose on a first down run against the Fort Davis Indians.



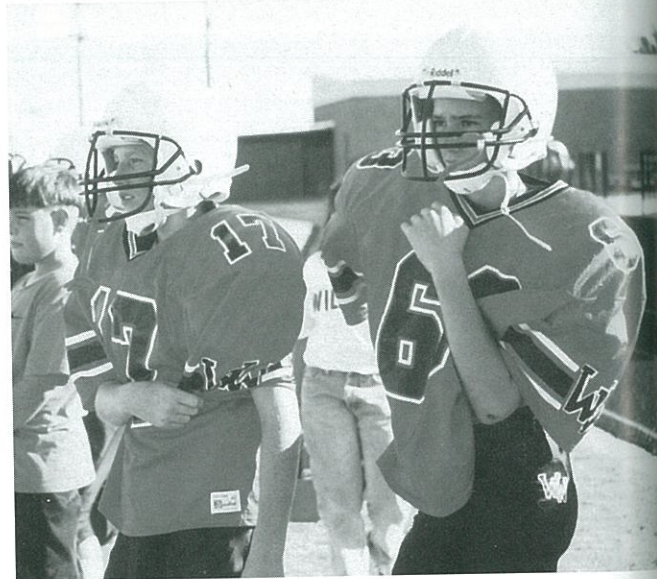
The team's leading passer, eighth grade quarterback Zach Hanna, prepares to hand-off to an oncoming runningback.

Seventh graders William Wilkinson and John Paul Jones intently watch the game, as they wait for their turn to return to the action.

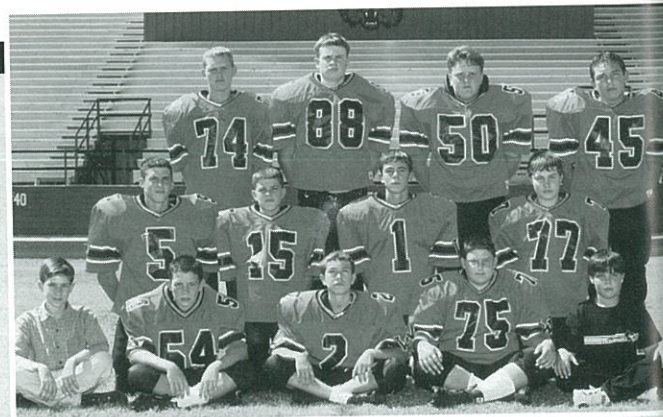
