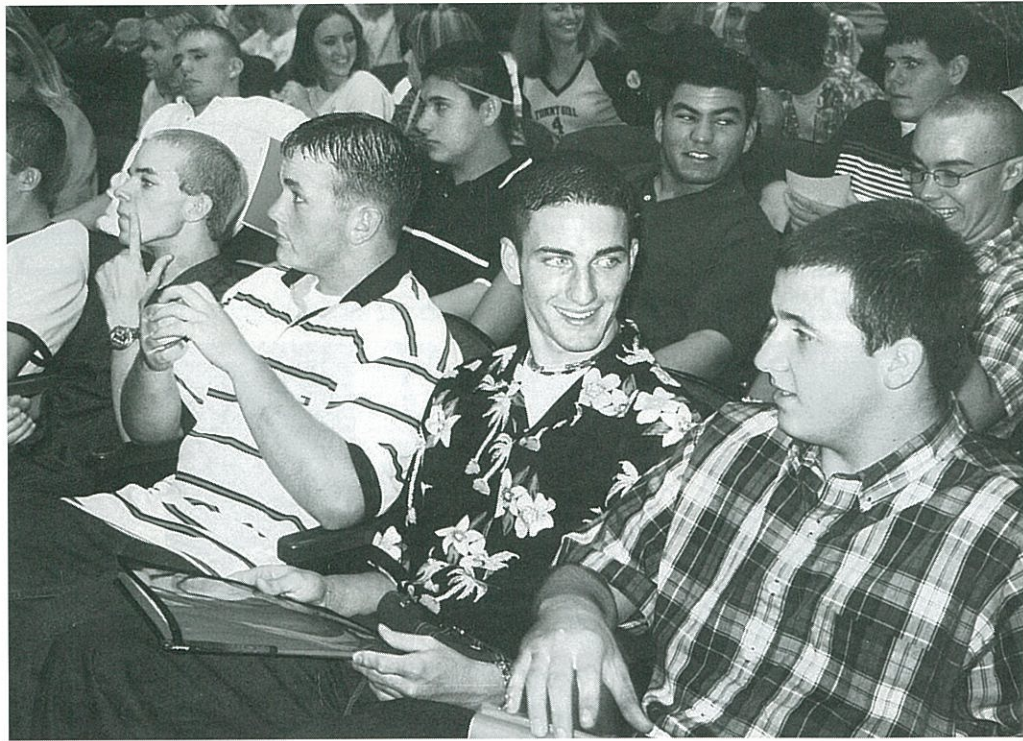


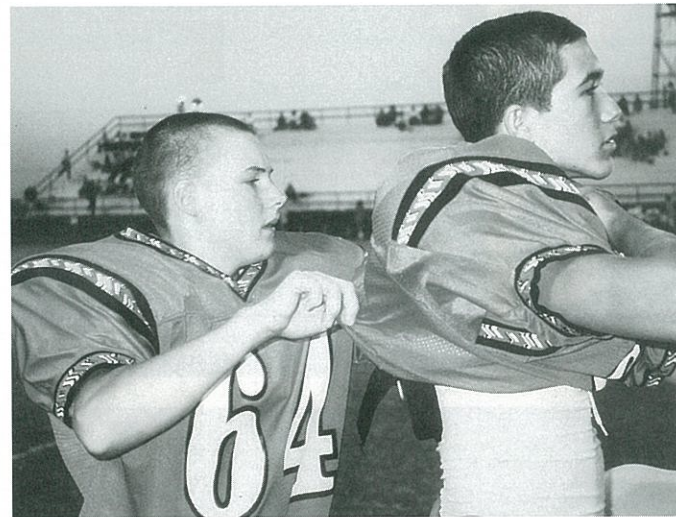
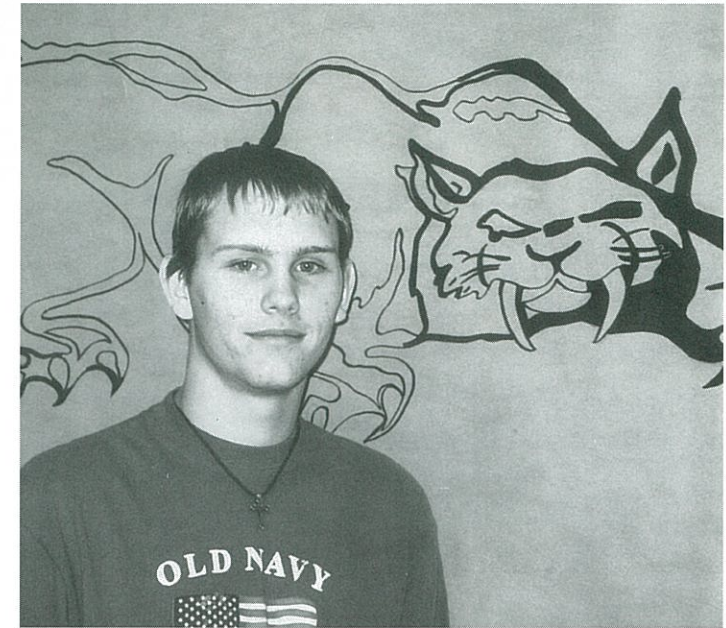

Sophomores Reva Hernandez and Monique Hernandez enjoy morning break.



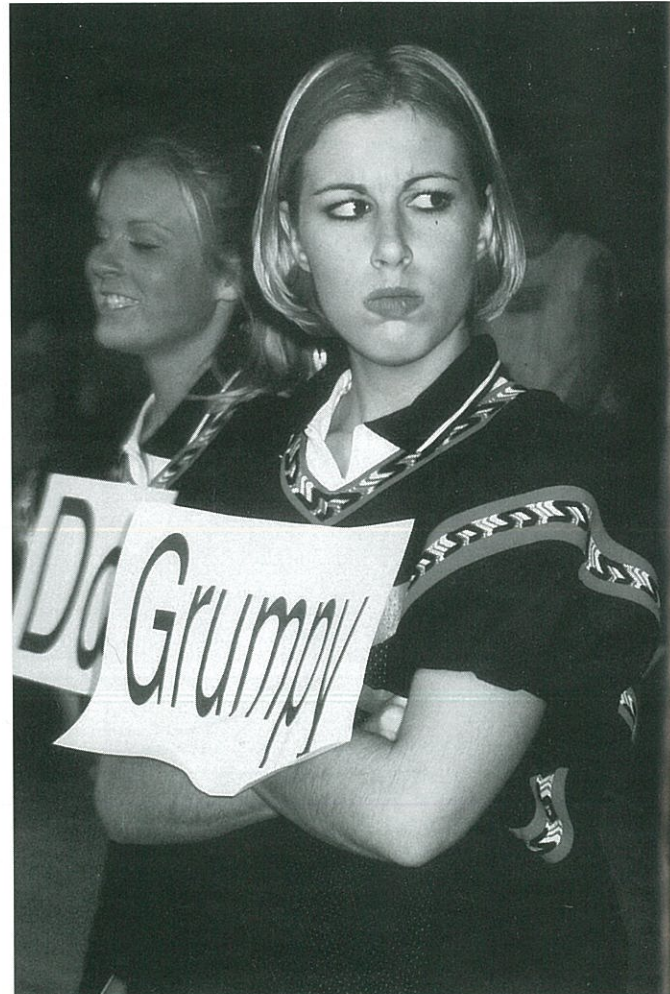
Senior Mallory Bryan displays a copy of the *Odessa American* proclaiming her to be the Permian Basin's volleyball player-of-the-year.

Sophomore Brandon Wolfe puts his artistic abilities to good use by designing a wall sign for the Lady Cats. The sign graced the wall of the game gym.

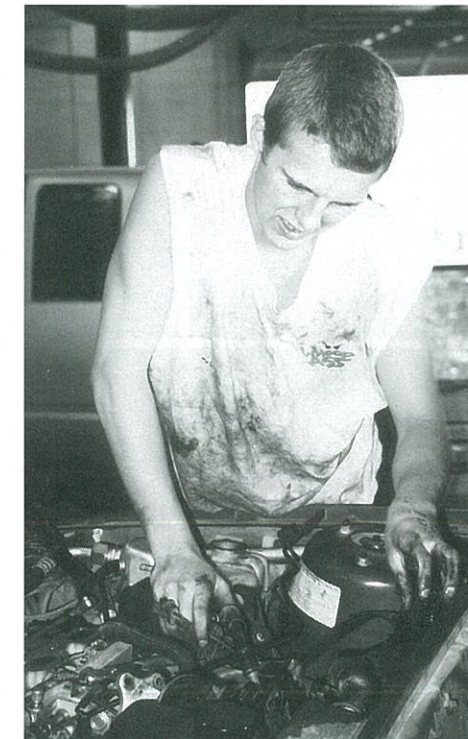
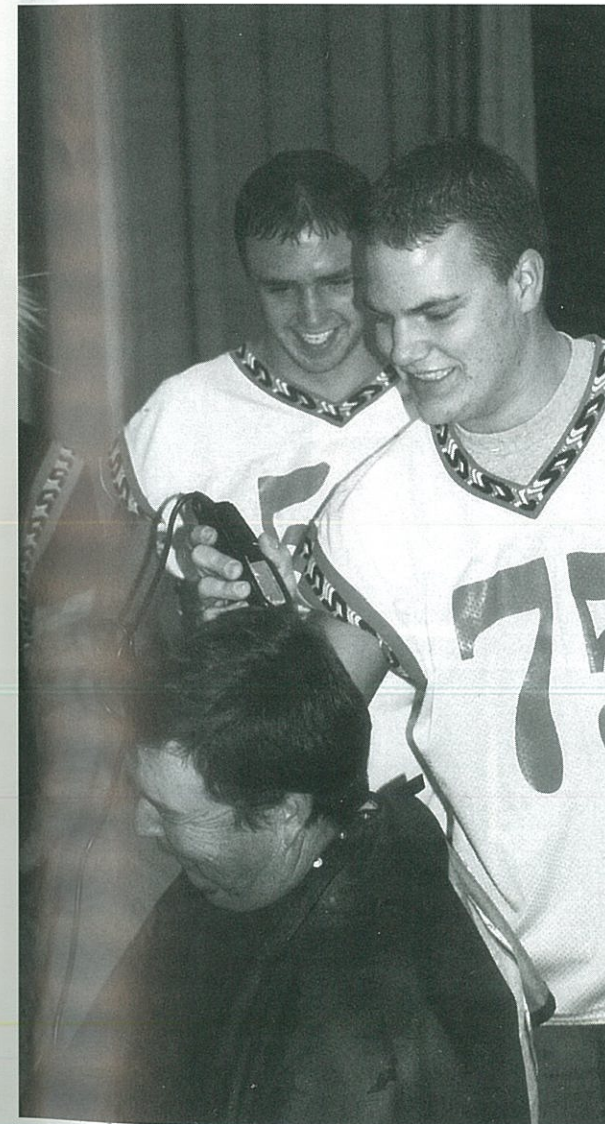


Wildcat Colby Worden comes to the aid of teammate Garrett Wolf as they rush to suit up for a game after performing with the band.
